Mag No 178 - Sunday 31st October - The Well with the Inn Ogbourne St George

It was good to be back to good old fashioned hashing today – nine miles worth of mud and hills and hundreds of false trails that caught the unwary on this grey, damp and overcast Sunday. About 20 runners and walkers gathered outside the pub gossiping and pleased to see each other. 11 o'clock came and there was no sign of Keith our hare. No time to worry though as at precisely 17 seconds past 11 he galloped up with a big grin.

The briefing was in standard format: It's about six and a quarter miles he said - translation - It is at least nine miles. There's no mud or hills he said - translation - if you are a fell runner or a water buffalo you will be fine. There's no bull in the field where it says 'Beware of the Bull' he said - translation - it will be hiding behind a tree until you arrive and then rush out at you. Off in a loop round the village and then along a lane to open fields and a cluster of thatched cottages near the main Marlborough road. Sailor (from North Wilts Hash) was way ahead by this time but I was, unusually, at the front of the following pack and just saw him disappearing up a steep path leading to the Ridgeway. So, across the main road and up this steep muddy path that seemed to go up for ever. Lots of false trails on the way up, which the front runners ignored and so when we arrived at the top the pack was pretty spread out. The trail then became a blur of fields and lanes and woods - all muddy. We then came to the circle that started the rot. It was near an enormous puddle in the woods next to a parting of the ways. The correct route was straight ahead but only 20 yards ahead was a cross roads - with no circle. How do you kick out a circle to say "it's ahead for a bit and then its left". I failed to do this and the back markers, Brian and Marion and all the walkers, lost the trail. Another few miles of fields and lanes and then down a long narrow path to the road and the pub. It only took me an hour and a half to run the 9 miles and so I must be getting fitter. Brian and Marion took 3 hours and most of the walkers are still out there. The apres was relaxed and enjoyable as always. I was standing in for GOMargaret (off on some jolly in Devon) and was in a quandary about when to do the little thank you speech. Should one wait for the stragglers to come in, by which time all the front runners will have gone home, or should one speak while there is still someone to speak to. There's no answer to that. Thank you Keith for another well-crafted and enjoyable run.
