Spot on, the Crown & Anchor appear on the coat of arms of the Lord High Admiral and, for retired Naval Officers who set up taverns, was a nice way of showing their nautical roots and remembering those carefree days being keel-hauled and dunked in barrels.

As we gathered in the car park it was good to see there a sizable number of runners and walkers. As Jeremy gave his preamble (pre' in advance of; amble 'an unhurried walk') he assured us the run would last just one hour (good) and the runners must not use any footbridges (not so good as I had left my shoes behind and my trainers would have to do me for the pub afterwards). He then announced the trail began at the front of the pub.


