We stopped for a convivial chat and then went on across muddy fields and forests of stinging nettles back to the pub.

We few, we happy few, we band of brothers (and sisters) gathered round a small table in the pub and chatted about this and that over a very nice drop of beer. Lovely atmosphere. In the absence of our leader I stood up and thanked Kevin for an excellent and challenging trail and the rest of us for braving the weather to run/walk it. As we seem to have run out of things to present (Brian admitted that he held the green bags but wanted to polish them before presenting them) and we have not seen the horn for weeks – I sat down again.
